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Culinary Institute of America (CIA), Day Trip December 6

An update on the field trip to the library of the Culinary Institute of America (CIA) in Hyde Park, NY.

The date will definitely be **Saturday 6 December.** I'll post specifics on the Settmour Swamp Yahoo and Facebook groups in mid-November.

Hyde Park is about 1 1/2 hours from the Morristown area, so it is perhaps 2 - 2 1/2 hours for those who live in the more southern and western reaches of the Barony.

About a dozen folks is the largest group that would work well -- no librarians are on duty on Saturdays at the

Culinary Institute, so I'd be serving as the research guide/reference librarian for this expedition.

Two of the CIA restaurants are open on Saturdays, so we need to select one for lunch.

One, the **Bocuse** (click <u>here</u> for the menu), is fairly high-end French cuisine, and the other, **American Bounty** (click <u>here</u> for the menu), is Hudson Valley seasonal. Please check these out and let me know your preferences.

We will need to make reservations for whichever restaurant we go to, so I'll want a fairly solid head count before the end of November.

Again, I'll post more specifics next month -- when and where we'll meet, and the consensus on what restaurant to go to.

Olive Recipies as taught by Master Galefridus

We had an olive play date at the Glen Gardner fight practice and A&S gathering on 14 October. I brought a large box of raw olives, a bunch of unredacted medieval recipes, and a couple of cures that I had just started. We sorted olives (when you buy in bulk, you end up discarding about 10%-15%) and talked a bit about the process of redacting medieval recipes. A few of the braver folks tasted the raw olives to get sense of what the curing process needs to do to make olives palatable. Folks had a great time, and I'm hoping that we will all meet with success with our cures.

The recipes I handed out are below – I invite folks to try them and experiment a bit with recipe redaction. Contact me (galefridus@optimum.net) if you have questions on how to proceed, or if none of the recipes strike your fancy, let me know and I'll supply more.

From Abū al-Khayr al-Shajjār al-Ishbīlī, *Kitāb al-Filāha*, an 11th century Seville farm manual; English translation available at <u>filaha.org</u>:

Preparation of Olives in Brine

Take green olives that have been lightly crushed and scald them with boiling water. Then put them in a container with well-salted water and cover them with the leaves of bay, fennel and citron. A few days after this, add a little salt and a bundle of thyme.

Another method is to take olives in autumn and pit them with a pointed reed. Then wash them with plenty of water. Then put the fruit in a jar with leaves of thyme, mountain balm, bay, citron and mint. Fill with a liquid composed of one third drinking water and two thirds vinegar, well mixed, then seal the container until the olives are preserved.

A third method: Gather good white olives in October and wash them as described above. Put them in a jar and sprinkle with salt, then with oil, then flavor with leaves of mint, thyme, coriander, fennel, citron and bay. Complete the process by covering the olives with syrup of honey and vinegar [oxymel]. Finally, stuff the opening of the receptacle with the leaves of sumac and fennel and seal it tightly.

My translation of the first of two cures from Ibn Razīn al-Tujībī, *Fadālat al-Khiwān fi Tayyibāt al-Taʻām wa-al-Alwān*, a 13th century Andalusian cookbook. I have not yet translated the second cure.

First recipe. Select olives harvested in October and November, large or small. Wash and put them in an oiled jar or one that served to contain oil in successive layers: olives, lime [the fruit] and thyme from Šardūn [Sardinia?], until the jar is filled. Then pour in clear water to cover and

leave covered for several days. Then check; if needed, add water, and salt.

The *Geoponika*, a 10th century Byzantine farm manual lists six cures. I have selected the first three, all attributed to Florentinus:

Very fine conserved olives. Florentinus. Taking large perfect olives, picked by hand, cut them round with a sharp reed and put them in a new jar, not yet pitched, sprinkling on top a very little salt, and when it has dissolved have ready another jar, with honey if available, if not, hepsema [concentrated grape must] and a citron leaf, and put the olives into this marinade so that it covers them. Some add fennel seed, caraway, celery seed and dill to this marinade, and make quite a remarkable olive conserve, which is unfamiliar to many.

*Olives in oxymeli**. Same author. Take long ones with their stalks, best quality of course, black and unbruised, wash in cold water and dry on wicker mats; then put them in a bowl and pour olive oil on them and sprinkle on fine salt, one choinix [about 1.1 liters] to nine choinikes of olives; move them gently with the hands but do not let them bruise; then put them in a jar, pour in oxymeli so that it covers them, top with fennel fronds, and store.

* Oxymel is a vinegar and honey syrup used primarily for making a non-alcoholic thirst quencher. It is the basis for sekanjabin. The translator/editor recommends a recipe for oxymel from Dioscorides' *Materia Medica*: "Take 5 kotylai wine

vinegar, 1 mna sea salt, 10 mnai liquid honey, 1 kotylai water; mix and boil until one-tenth has boiled away; cool and store." Kotylai = cups; mna/i = lb/lbs.

Conserve in must. Same author. Picking white olives [very light green] they marinate them in seawater for six days. Then they put them in a jar and pour fresh must in, but they do not completely fill it or the must would overflow in fermenting; after fermentation they seal it. Others put in a handful of salt before the must, and then the olives, and seal when it has fermented.

Our game is not perfect, but nothing is. We rely on mutual respect and self awareness to keep a fair playing field, and a fun, competitive experience.


Communicate with your opponent

The best way to write an article is to find some topic that interests you and just start working on it.

Open a new document and **BRAIN DUMP** questions or thoughts or ideas.

It does not need to be organized or structured at first. Just get the ideas down on paper.

Then make a copy of all these ideas and paste them into the top of the document. Start organizing them. Don't worry about losing

any of your ideas. You are working on a copy. Structure your thoughts into groups. Just copy and paste and rearrange.

Then start asking questions. How do you make a red dye or how did they use icing on cakes (did they use icing on cakes?)

Ask your local Laurels or Cooks or Fighters or Fencers or Weavers for help and books.

Write down what you learn. Add photographs to show the key points of your article. Think of it as explaining what you learned to another person.

Equestrian Tip from Kiena

Why do some horses wear blankets while others do not? Horses grow a thick second coat for the winter months. This coat will fluff out when it's cold and acts as wind blocker as needed. Some horses either don't grow a really thick winter coat or get clipped. So in these cases, it's critical that the horse wears a coat to protect them from the elements.

Why do some horses get clipped?

When horses get exercised during the winter, their coat gets very sweaty and this can take a lot of time to dry out. So, it's generally better to clip their coats so you don't expose them to potentially risky conditions.
