## Favorite Mudthaw Moments - Saga of the Outdoor Kitchen

#### This year's Mudthaw feast was a disastrous, but successful adventure.

After finding out we had <u>no use of the kitchen</u>, we were provided a table in the hallway without access to an electrical outlet and outdoor space on the back deck. I'm sure those of you who attended can attest it was windy and cold. <u>Very cold</u>. But we remained calm.

This could work, This would work. We'd encountered obstacles before. Except on this day, anything that could happen, did happen.

Multiple problems arose... we acquired extension cords but then the electricity didn't work!

We <u>couldn't get the propane stove lit</u> at all and had to call for help from a chivalrous lord to fix the situation. However, there was not enough heat and we called for back up, eventually deciding to <u>shuttle food back and forth to Charis' house</u> to make sure it was warm.

The outdoor space itself provided a challenge. We were constantly re-boiling water and relighting the Sterno to keep the food warm in the cold, because there was no space inside. 






## Highlighting a Swampie, Lady Maerhild




RIP Lady Nadira of the Lonely Tower

#### Fencing Tip from Don Orlando Sforza

Orlando's **Mudthaw Solutions** (dealing with Mud problems)

I will begin by stating that there are no problems, only challenges.

Flexibility is paramount; if you are unwaveringly committed to your plan, you may collapse in a heap of frustration and anxiety. We have encountered challenges during several years of running fencing at Mudthaw. In one case the mud was just too muddy. The marshals found a space in the parking lot, and were able to set up lists. In another, the rains descended. We cleared benches beneath an A frame and fenced in there, rather than cease our activities. As herald, I have run through the site seeking individuals their Excellencies wish to see, tracking down scrolls, improvising in court on request. We have encountered ovens going out, eleventh hour vigils, over-run courts and plumbing issues, but we have always walked out in the wee hours after cleaning up with happy hearts for a job well done. No worries, it's all good.



#### Fencing Tip from Don Orlando Sforza

Orlando's Fencing Tips; About Time

The Italian fencing masters gained their title for good reason; they had a lifetime of experience and the combined knowledge of the line of masters who taught them. Which is why, when the masters instruct that the fencer should attack in tempo, then we should heed their wisdom. Many fencers today learn the two count parry - riposte. First, one beats away the incoming attack, then responds by extending and returning the attack. This two count attack is drilled into fencers until it becomes muscle memory. Unfortunately, this duo tempo motion is easily defeated by feints. The contra tempo attack, however, is one



that takes advantage of the opponents attack by extending into the attack, in essence combining one's parry and thrust. By angling the counter thrust while extending and twisting the wrist so that the hand is in fourth position and the quillions turning clockwise, one can close the line of attack and guide the incoming blade to the outside line. By drilling the single tempo attack, this will be the fencers ingrained response to an opponent's threat, and you will be winning bouts in just no time at all.

#### Chamberlain Tip from Baroness Rhiannon

## Here are a few GUIDELINES for borrowing Swamp equipment:

Make a list of everything you may need.

<u>The Head Cook</u> is responsible for cooking and serving gear (pots, bowls, platters, utensils, etc.).

<u>The Autocrat</u> is in charge of everything else (EZ-ups, tables, list posts and ropes, road signs, etc.).

Note: Troll Box is managed by the exchequer and is not kept in the storage locker.

Plan your strategy for transporting the equipment to and from the event. Is your vehicle big enough?

Do you need to borrow someone else's? Do you need someone to help with the heavy lifting?

Contact the Chamberlain to arrange a mutually convenient day and time to get what you need. This should happen at least one month before the event. Even if (especially if) you want to pick up things the night before the event, you need to make the arrangements well in advance. The more notice, the more likely the Chamberlain will be able to accommodate you.

Be aware that the **storage unit has no lights** and finding what you need in the dark is not easy.

The Chamberlain needs to be present, both to let you in – the front gate is locked after hours and the unit has a padlock and key – and to inventory what is borrowed and returned.

I do not drive at night if I can avoid it and not at all if it is raining – very bad vision.

<u>Kitchen gear</u> is stored presently in the Chamberlain's garage. There are lights and I don't have to drive anywhere, so the logistics are better for that. Be aware though, that my driveway can get icy in bad winter weather and it is on an incline.

Everything you borrow will be **counted going out and coming back**, and you will need to sign for it. You will get a copy of the list. This helps us keep track of where things are and if anything needs to be repaired or replaced. It also helps you to distinguish what you brought to the event and what belongs to the site. Things can get confused after a long tiring day.

Don't forget about the **spice box**. You can arrange to get this in advance of the other kitchen equipment, so you can start cooking when you need to and don't have to get the other cooking and serving gear until closer to the event, if you like. Spices traditionally cost more when purchased in small quantities. That's why we sometimes buy in bulk and keep these extras for use by the cooks of subsequent events. Please

check the box before you buy more of the same. If anything is past its prime, feel free to toss it and buy fresh.

Before returning equipment, please make sure everything is **clean and dry** (this includes dish towels) and in working order. If anything needs repair or replacement, please make a note of it and let the Chamberlain know.


