

A&S Class—Knitted Hose

This Month's Third Friday A&S Thingy, (November 20th) will have a class included -

Learn to make a pair of knitted hose

Taught by our own Lovely Lady Vivian de Dunbar!

During the class you will receive instruction on how to construct a pair of knitted hose that is made to fit you. I will help you take your measurements and then we will be knitting swatches to determine your stitches per inch. I will then walk you through the math (don't be scared) and help you create your own personal stocking pattern. Wear something that can easily expose your leg for measuring.

This class will require prior knitting experience. You will need to know how to knit in the round and be consistent enough in your stitching that your gauge will not change over the long time it will take you to knit both stockings. Prior sock making experience a plus as we will be making our own patterns based on your own personal measurements.

Materials needed:

- -At least 600 yards of fingering weight (or smaller) yarn in the color of your choice. (yardage is hard to determine as it depends on your measurements and how tall you want your stockings to be). Period European stockings would be made of wool or silk, however if you buy mundane "sock yarn" that has nylon or acrylic added in they will wear longer. It is also your decision as to if you want "superwash" sock yarn or not.
- -a set of double pointed needles, or 2 circular needles to knit the stocking in a size appropriate to the weight of yarn you are using (here is where that knitting experience comes in, for a fingering weight yarn I would suggest no bigger than a size 3 needle, I prefer size 1). Double pointed needles are more period but I prefer knitting mundane socks on 2 circular needles. (I can teach you both ways and you can decide for yourself.)
- -any knitting notions you are comfortable with using(stitch markers, row counter etc). these are optional, you can use your pattern to count rows.

I will provide everything we need to measure and make the patterns. We will do some hands on knitting and I will have a handout that details the construction of the stocking.

Interview with a Knight By Jonathan Miles

What is your society name with appropriate/preferred titles?

Sir William MacCrimmon



- How long have you been a knight? Its been two months since I was knighted at Pennsic. (08/07/2015)
- What does it mean to be a new knight?

The accolade of knighthood is a recognition of things that are already present in a candidate:

Skill at arms. Courtesy on and off the field. Helping, encouraging and teaching others on and off the field.

In my vigil all of my teachers from the last 25 years told me that they thought I was ready and up to the challenge of knighthood, so even if it's a bit begrudgingly, I have to

believe that I won't embarrass them if I keep doing what got me to this point.

Not much has changed, I've still got to practice, improve my fighting and teaching and take better care of myself so I can keep fighting.

The only obvious changes are that the white belt keeps me from surprising opponents on the list field and that the Unbelted fighters are perhaps more eager to try to flatten me in public. :-)

- What would you like people to know about your history and role within the society?
 - I went to my first SCA event in December, 1988 out in the Midrealm (Caer Anterth Mawr / Milwaukee, WI) and started fighting a year or so later. In some ways I'm still a transplanted Midrealmer and I travel a few times a year to visit friends in Northshield, Meridies, Calontir and the Midrealm.
 - I'm shy, but much less so in armor.
 - I'm happy to help, ask if you've got a question, especially about fighting. Don't be surprised if I have to refer you to someone else for your answer.
 - I'm a college librarian, so if you've got questions about something else I might be able to point you in the right direction. Just don't ask me to do your homework for you. :-)
 - Beta Ray Bill and Bagger Vance are pretty sweet as nicknames go. :-)



Interview with a Knight (Sir William MacCimmon, cont.)

• How should newcomers to the SCA view your title and station, how should they approach you?

Politely? I don't bite, unless I haven't eaten in 6-8 hours.

What's your favorite aspect of martial combat?

As long as I fight well, win, lose or draw, I love competing in singles tournaments most of all.

• Do you practice any other forms of Martial Art, past or present?

I studied Hung Ga kung fu for about five years under Sifu Pedro Cepero. Ten years later I still do some of the drills on occasion, but what I learned is more in my head than in my hands.

- What's your advice to the new fighter?
 - Figure out who can give you good advice about how to fight and train without breaking yourself. Listen politely to advice, then sit down with those you trust to figure out what's good advice and what will work well for you.
 - Time in armor will break a body down so quite a bit of work needs to be done out of armor to stay healthy. Do yoga, dance or spend time in the gym making your body stronger and more flexible. The stronger and healthier you are, the more fun you'll get to have in armor.
 - Ceaselessly practice the basics.
 - Fighting is great stress relief. Leave your stress in your friends' armor, that's what it's there for. :-)
 - If it's too much, take a few days off and get back in touch with your mellower self so you don't snap in armor. That won't end well for anyone.
 - There are a lot of wonderful fighters out there. Travel when you can and try to hit them, then go have a beer with them.
 - Don't let anyone steal your joy in the fight or the game.
 - Win graciously. Lose graciously.

32 years ago on this date I became **Queen of the East** for the first time.

I was wearing some magnificent Italian Renn made by then <u>Lady Cassadoria</u>, still the best



maker of garb in the SCA imho. The silk brocade had a pattern of phoenixes rising from flames, which was appropriate since I had gone from banished by Siegfried and Wanda to Crown Princess in two weeks time.

The fabric, which I never could have afforded, was a gift from many of my closest friends left behind in my SCA home, BMDL (Barony Marche of the Debatable Lands). I know that <u>Mistress</u> <u>Achren</u> spearheaded the effort, and for that and many other kindnesses, I have never been able to properly express my thanks.


There was a tension in the event. **Gavin** and I had just been married the previous

August, and <u>Viktor</u> won for me, fighting for me one last time with Gavin's blessing. Since I had also been Viktor's lady for a time, the entire arrangement caused some confusion. So folks were a little curious about how Viktor and Gavin were going to get along. As the knights swore fealty (each individually) the tension grew until it was Gavin's turn. All the other knights let him be the last.

So Gavin knelt to his new King and made a very nice oath. Viktor responded with a fairly standard response, but the said he had a special charge to lay upon Earl Sir Gavin. He was to **guard**the King's lady "as if she were

your very own." - which broke all the tension and was pretty much Viktor's best speech of the reign.

Sedalia's Stories Random Memories of an SCA Long Past

While there are many events that I recall from my second time as Princess of the East, there was one that took place shortly before Gavin and I succeeded to the throne. (1988)

There was a heated exchange going on between Their Majesties, Morghun II and Rowan II, and the (first time I think) Autocrat about two things.

First, there was <u>no Royal Room</u> (which even back then was generally common at RP events). His Majesty Morghun really wanted a Royal Room, as a place where regalia could be left safely out of sight during the day, and a place for scrolls and other items to be presented at Court that evening to be kept out of sight.

The lady Autocrat was particularly unpleasant, but finally gave in. She drew the curtains across a **small alcove** that was pretty much filled with folding tables, stacked up. There was no way to even put a chair in there the space was so tight. There was enough room for the male royals to change together, but Queen Rowan and I had to take turns – there is **just so much you can smoosh two women** changing into late 16th Century together in about a 4 x 5 space.

The second bone of contention was the **Queen's presence**. The autocrat initially told Her she would have to leave as the event was "**sold out**". The autocrat made it very clear that **Her Majesty had to be out of the hall** after Court since there was no room for her.

It became a running joke amidst the Peers about whether the autocrat had insulted each of them yet. Viscount Sir Edward quipped about having finally made it in the East, since she had already insulted him a few times. This all lead to His

Majesty of Acre, Shannon, who was attending the event in part to cement the relationship for Pennsic XVII



between the East and Acre, complaining that HE had not yet been insulted. Even when it was pointed out that he was not actually SCA royalty, Shannon reminded us all that he was still an SCA Earl and Knight. He spent a lot of time that afternoon grumbling, with tongue firmly planted in his cheek that he was offended that he was apparently not significant enough to be offended.

Probably the highlight of the day came when we were getting dressed for Court. The autocrat yelled into the curtained alcove, when Gavin and Morghun were dressing, that they had to

"move your royal asses and get out of there" because she wanted to get the feast tables set up before

she wanted to get the feast tables set up before Court.

Let's just say that after that, the list of Court business for the evening changed.

After the very slightly abbreviated Court, the autocrat was at it again, telling the Crown that the Queen needed to leave now. Eventually, the autocrat grudgingly agreed she would place an extra chair at High Table for Her Majesty. The autocrat then followed it up with a warning to Rowan that she **better not eat anything** though.

The War Puppies from Ostgardr decided to show what they thought of that by ordering **Dominos pizza** to the hall and bringing up one box to high table. **Duchess Sedalia MacNare**


