



Upcoming Exhibit at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York,

The Art of Illumination: The Limbourg Brothers and the Belles Heures of Jean de France, Duc de Berry, March 2, 2010 – June 13, 2010,. Robert Lehman Wing

The *Belles Heures* (1405–1408/9) of Jean de Berry, a treasure of The Cloisters collection, is one of the most celebrated and lavishly illustrated manuscripts in this country. Because it is currently unbound, it is possible to exhibit all of its illuminated pages as individual leaves, a unique opportunity never to be repeated. The exhibition will elucidate the manuscript, its artists—the young Franco-Netherlandish Limbourg Brothers—and its patron, Jean de France, duc de Berry. A select group of precious objects from the same early-fifteenth-century courtly milieu will place the manuscript in the context of the patronage of Jean de Berry and his royal family, the Valois.

Culinary Corner

Recipes Submitted by Wilhelm van Utrecht

Tournai-style Cameline Sauce (Winter Cameline Sauce)

MeasurementIngredient3 SlicesGood White Bread½ tspGround Nutmeg24 ThreadsSaffron½ tspCinnamon½ tspGround Ginger3 ¾ CupsWhite Wine (Medium Dry)

34 Cup Brown Sugar

Preparation:

Finely grind the saffron in a coffee grinder until it is powderized.


Grind the bread into bread crumbs and put to the side.

Combine in a pot the white wine, ground nutmeg, powderized saffron, cinnamon, ground ginger and the reserved bread crumbs. Bring to a boil and then strain into another pot through a fine sieve. Add the brown sugar, return to heat through until the sugar is dissolved. Serve with beef, pork or poultry.

I served this with sliced beef on the grill at picnic in the park a few years ago and it was a big hit.



White Garlic Sauce

This sauce is ideal with boiled chicken but also goes well with steamed vegetables (especially asparagus and artichokes). serves 6

34 Cup Blanched Almonds
2 Garlic Cloves Peeled

2 Slices white bread, crusts removed, roughly chopped

2 Cups Well Strained Chicken Stock, Hot

Salt & Freshly ground pepper

Crush the almonds in a mortar, add the garlic cloves, and continue to work. Soak the bread in 1 cup of hot stock and crush until you have a smooth puree: add the garlic and almonds to the crushed bread. Mix well and add the remaining stock in a thin, even stream, working consistency to obtain the desired consistency. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

Personally I love this sauce. This is great with roasted chicken or turkey. It is wonderful with smoked meats. I love to barbeque and am constantly looking for new sauces.

Modern Twist

As a modern twist, add a chipotle pepper seeded and cored to food processor and add to the puree and spice it up!


