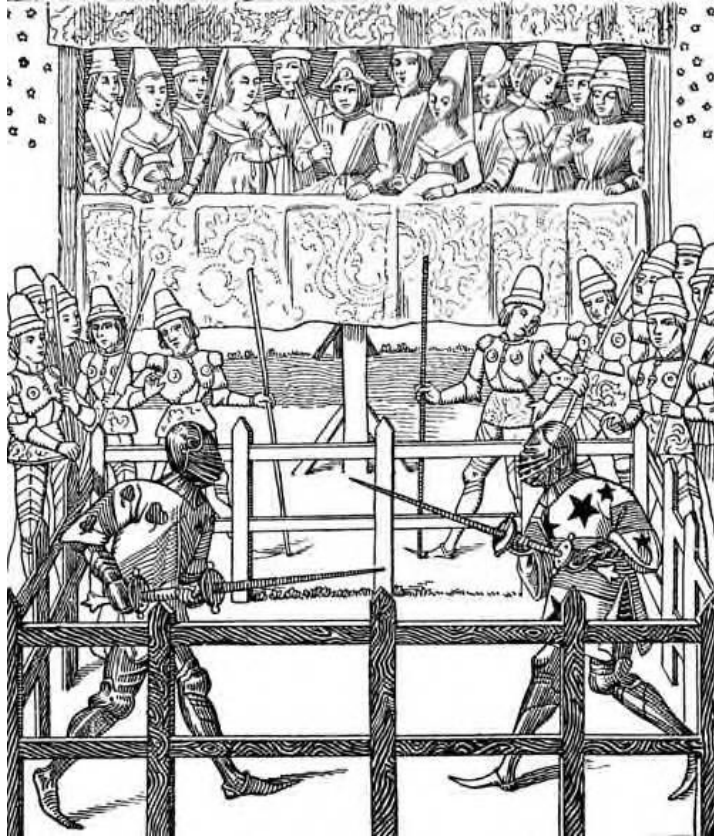

The Barony of Settmour Swamp proudly invites one and all to a weekend of camping, questing, and competition: our 24th Quest for Wit and Wisdom! Among the many activities planned throughout this three-day weekend are tournaments of skill and prowess with which to impress your fellow gentles. This year's Quest will be a playful romp touching all parts of Egyptian mythology. Solve riddles and perform wondrous feats in pursuit of the ultimate prize and recognition.

Over the weekend, we will engage in competitions for our new Baronial Champions (All are welcome to compete). For those adept at battle, there will be Heavy Fighting, Fencing, Thrown Weapons, and Archery. For our equally impressive craftsmen, we will have an A&S and a brewing competition.

This year the Swamp will be holding its inaugural Youth Fighter Baronial Champion Tournament on Saturday. The tournament is specifically for the division 3 fighters, age 14- 17. The format of the tourney will be Round Robin and will require the combatants to fight in all weapon forms, sword and shield, greatsword, two sword and polearm. Weapon authorizations will be held in the early part of the day for those who need it.

A delicious feast prepared by Cassandra deMatisse will be laid forth to those onboard attendees. And finally, about the evening fire, we will engage in the ever-entertaining Baronial Bardic competition.

On Sunday, in the morning hours, there will be Hurley for players and spectators alike, Sofia will be hosting a Knitting class at newcomers point. Around 1:00 PM begins the annual Quest, this year prepared by Galen MacByrne. And last, but certainly not least, comes Baronial court wherein the new Baronial Champions will be announced from the winners of the weekend's many tournaments.

Children are welcome and there will be various activities for them to participate in. We ask you to please supervise your children at all times. Anyone under the age of eighteen who is not with a parent must be accompanied by an adult and must present a consent form signed by a parent which includes contact information for the parents. If a minor does not have a blue SCA membership card then a minor waiver signed by a parent or guardian must be presented at troll. Pets are welcome as long as they are leashed and cleaned up after.

Merchants are welcome. There is no charge for space but you must provide your own tables.

The campground will be open from 4:00 PM Friday until 12:00 noon Monday. It is a damp site, which means that beer, wine, and mead are permissible, but no distilled alcohol. Running water is not available onsite, so please bring bottled water to last through the weekend. Accommodations include port-o-johns and dumpsters for garbage disposal. There will be separate containers for recyclables (glass, plastic, and paper) at the county's request. There will also be a central firepit for socializing.

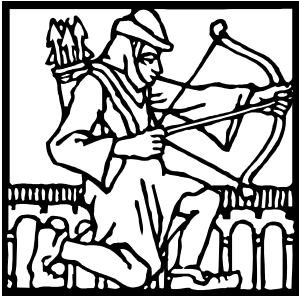
The schedule for the first few workshops is as follows: (Shortly we will have this info added to our on-line calendar) : June 10

BARONIAL OFFICERS SEEK DEPUTIES

The following baronial officers are in need of a deputy:

Chamberlain – maintains the inventory of baronial assets

Exchequer – in charge of baronial funds

Mistress of Lists – responsible for running the list at heavy weapons tournaments

Youth Combat – oversees youth boffer combat

NOTE: Some positions require an individual to be warranted. Anyone interested in becoming a deputy, please contact the incumbent officer for complete details. Their contact information may be found on the website and on the last page of this newsletter.

From the Baronial Policy and Procedures manual, Section II, Item J:

1. All officers are encouraged to appoint at least one deputy. There shall only be one designated “drop dead” deputy per office.
2. All “drop dead” deputy officers must be paid members of the SCA, Inc.
3. A single designated deputy officer shall count towards quorum in the absence of the Baronial officer.
4. A single designated deputy officer shall automatically receive the proxy of his/her superior officer at Baronial Business Meetings, if said deputy is in attendance and the Baronial officer is not.

Franklin Institute of Science - Philadelphia, PA

Tutankhamen and The Golden Age of the Pharoahs – For the first time in 30 years, the golden artifacts of the boy-king have left their home in Egypt. The exhibition includes 130 objects from the tomb of King Tut and other Valley of the Kings ancestors which have never been seen in the United States. The famous death mask is not allowed to leave Egypt and is not part of the exhibit. Exhibit runs from February, 2007 through September 30, 2007.

Dueling Treatises: Martial Arts Manuals in Medieval & Renaissance Europe

Directions to Practices

Youth Fighter Practice - St. Paul's Church, Flemington

St Paul's is on Rt. 31 in Flemington, next door to the Hunterdon Medical Center, two miles north of the Flemington Circle

From Route 287

Go I-287 to US-202 (Exit 17), go southwest on US-202 to Flemington, NJ. Make first right in circle to get on NJ-31 North. Follow signs to Hospital. Make first left past hospital onto Gaunt Place, church is on left.

From Route 78 in Pennsylvania

Go East on I-78 to NJ-31 (Exit 17). Go South on NJ-31. Follow signs for Hospital. Turn right onto Gaunt Place, church is on left.

From New Jersey Turnpike

South to I-78 West/New Jersey Tpke Ext East Ramp towards Exits 14 To 14C/Cars-Trucks-Buses. Merge onto I-78 West Ramp. Take I-78 Express Lane West towards Garden State Parkway/Clinton. I-78 Express Lane West becomes I-78 West. Take I-287 (Exit 29) towards Somerville (US-202/206). Merge onto I-287 South ramp. Merge onto I-287 S. Take the US-202 South/US-206 South exit (Exit 17) towards Somerville (US-22 W)/Flemington. Stay straight, get on US-202 South until you reach Flemington. Take first right on circle to stay on NJ-31 North. Follow signs to hospital, make the first left after the hospital onto Gaunt Place. Church is on left.

From Garden State Parkway

Go North on Garden State Pkwy (Portions toll) to I-195 (Exit 98).
Go West on I-195 to I-295.
Go North on I-295 to I-95 South.
Go South on I-95 South to NJ-31 (Exit 4).
Go Northwest on NJ-31 to Flemington
Take first right on circle to stay on NJ-31 North, follow signs to Hospital. Make first left after the hospital onto Gaunt Place, church is on left.

From Philadelphia:

Go North on I-95 North to New Jersey.
Go North on I-95 North to NJ-31 (Exit 4).
Go Northwest on NJ-31 to Flemington
Go 1/2 way around circle to stay on NJ-31 North, follow signs to Hospital. Make first left after the hospital onto Gaunt Place, church is on left.

Nutley Fighter Practice

Note: Many of the exit ramps from Rt. 3 are sharp curves.

From NJ Route 3, Essex/Passaic County (East or West):

Take the Main Ave, Nutley-Passaic exit. At the bottom of the ramp, make left onto Main. Go past Bradlees to the next light, make a right onto Kingsland. Go to the first light and turn left onto Franklin. At the third light make a right onto Chestnut. Go one block and make left onto Hillside Crescent. The church is on the left-hand side; park on the street.

Alternate directions that will help you avoid traffic:

From the South:

Take the Garden State Parkway to Exit 151. At the end of the ramp turn right onto Watchung Ave. At the next light make a left onto East Passaic Ave. Take your second right onto Coeyman Ave. Make the first right onto Bromley Place. Bromley Place turns into Glenview Place. You will come to a stop sign at Ridge Road right after a curve (be careful). Continue straight and Glenview becomes Chestnut St. Continue straight through the traffic light at Bloomfield Ave.* At the top of the hill at Prospect Street Chestnut jogs to the right. Continue on Chestnut. Take the next right onto Hillside Crescent. The church will be on the left after the curve.

From Route 3 Westbound

Take the Passaic Ave exit. At the end of the ramp, make a left onto Passaic Ave. Follow directions from ** below

From Route 3 Eastbound:

Take the Passaic Ave exit. Stay to the right and merge with Ward Ave. At the next intersection (50 ft or so), make a left onto Passaic Ave.

**Passaic Ave turns into Cathedral Ave. Stay to the right at the fork in the road. At the end of Cathedral, make a right onto Kingsland St. Take the first left onto Bloomfield Ave. (across from Roche, at the railroad tracks). Take Bloomfield Ave. to the traffic light at Chestnut St. This should be the second traffic light. (Chestnut is one of those). The three streets on the left before Chestnut are Raymond Ave., Beech St. and Mountainview Ave. Continue from * above.

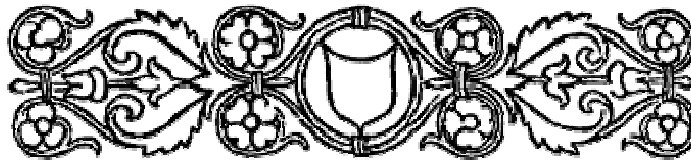


From the Canton of Gryphonwald

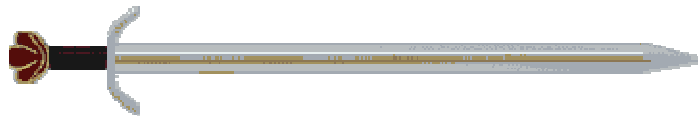
