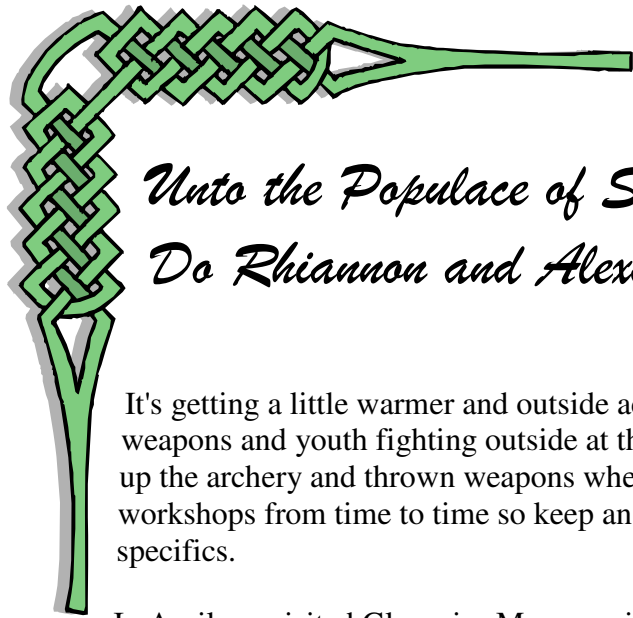

There is also a Gothic cathedral with Romanesque additions on the property as well as the original Victorian mansion. All are breathtaking and awe inspiring. I want to go back again and again. On May 9th Crown Tourney will take place in our neighboring Barony of Carillion and Alexander and I will be going to cheer on the contestants and to dine on the sumptuous feast prepared by our own Baroness Jehannine deFlanders. We hope to see many of you there to share in the fun.

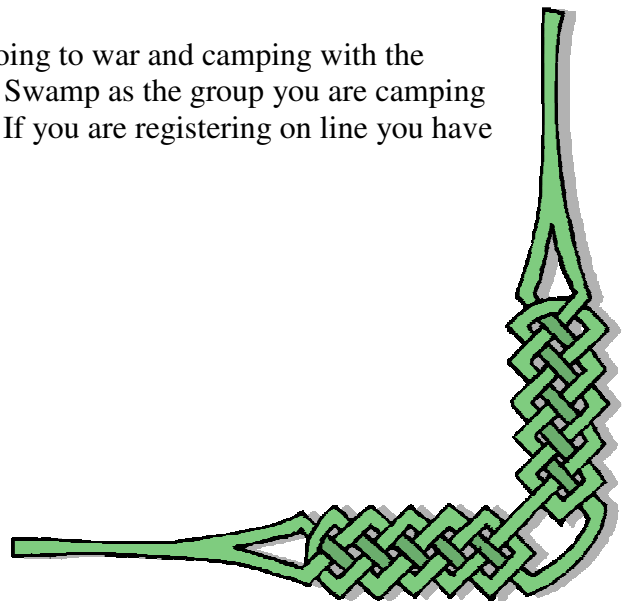

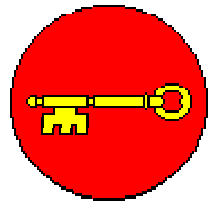
So play on and we'll see you soon.

Marshall of Fence

Rapier practice continues in Somerville on Thursdays at Maestro Fencing. The practice fee is \$5 per fencer. We had 40+ rapier fighters at Mudthaw. Special thanks to Lady Engracia and Lady Jehane for running the tournament. The tournament was 4 bear pits, each with a different weapons form. The person with the highest total in each form, entered the final rounds, having to fight with the weapons form they won their pit with. The 4 semi-finalists were: Don Armand de la Pour with single rapier, Nicolo with rapier and dagger, Don Ogedai with case of rapiers, and Don Nathaniel Wyatt with rapier and rigid parry. The finals saw Dons Ogedai and Wyatt square off with Nathaniel Wyatt proving the victor. As a note, two of the four semi-finalists were fencers who reside in Settmour Swamp: Don Armand and Nicolo.

In other news at Mudthaw: Lady Jehane was made a rapier marshal by Don Colin Monro, Southern Region Rapier Marshal. Lord Owyn Greenwood was promoted to the rank of provost in the League of Rapier Academies. Don Orlando Sforza, Chancellor of the league of Rapier Academies, took a polling of league members present to determine the future direction of the league.

Sunday practices in Flemington will have rapier practice resuming, with a concentration on individual and melee skills.

A & S Project of the Month Medieval Challah

Project description: (What time period; region is it from?)

Medieval challah was first baked in southern Germany in the 1400s. The Jewish women adopted a type of braided bread their Christian neighbors were making for Sunday and began baking it for their Sabbath bread.

Why did you choose to take on this project?

I have been doing research on medieval Jewish cooking and have baked bread for years. When I saw the description of Mudthaw that said there would be a bread baking contest, tackling this project seemed like a natural extension of what I had done previously.

Difficulty level: (beginner, intermediate, advance) - Intermediate

What materials are needed to complete this project? Sourdough starter, bread baking supplies, baking stone

How long did it take to complete? (or how long you've been working on it if it is not complete?)

I worked on this project pretty intensely for about a month, baking at least six batches of bread a week. I began by doing research in my own books on the history of Jewish cooking. Once I found out something about the bread (that it was German, had no eggs, little shortening, little sugar, was crusty, braided, and was made with sourdough), I started doing Internet research on any modern or "traditional" recipes that matched this description. (The type of challah we are familiar with today includes several eggs, sugar, and shortening, which were added to the recipe as the bread became popular in Eastern Europe.)

From an SCA food web site I learned that there were only four existing medieval bread recipes, so it was not worth hunting for challah recipes that were that old. Any research on traditional recipes is inherently fraught with problems: what does "traditional" mean? Was it the bread that your grandmother made, that she learned from her mother, who in turn learned it from hers? Was it the bread that your German neighbor made and said it came from Germany? Is there any way to figure out how old the recipe is since it may be decades or even centuries after the recipe was developed before it appears in print?

Even with these limitations, I did find a few recipes for Water Bread and Wasser Challah that gave me a starting place for my experiments with what could have been medieval challah. I tried many variations of amounts and experimented at replacing ingredients with those that would have been more in period (such as adding a little bit of whole wheat flour to the white since our modern flour is more refined than could be commonly done then). The modern recipes I found all used dry yeast, and I knew from the descriptions that this was a sourdough bread, so part of what I experimented with was how to make a bread similar to the ones with dry yeast using sourdough starter. I have been baking bread for over 40 years, but I had never tackled sourdough, so I gave myself a crash course in the subject.

What sources if any did you use as your basis for this project?

In addition to the books and Internet search mentioned above, I consulted with Cassandra Nelson about sourdough baking, and she graciously gave me encouragement and some starter. I also contacted the Bread Museum in Ulm, Germany to see if they knew more about the early versions of challah. I consulted AllExperts.com to quickly find out if there was any basis for making my bread with six or seven strands of dough, medieval Jews would have found significance in the numbers. I spent several hours in a futile search for that information on the Internet, and my librarian husband was equally unsuccessful, so I posted the question to the All Experts web site and had two answers within a day.

After a long day of events we will be having a great feast on Saturday evening prepared by Lord Riordan. With the theme this year you could say we'll be having a hell's kitchen, [but we promise - not too much yelling.] The feast will be limited to 100 gentles so we ask you to please reserve early. After the feast we challenge you to join us at the fire pit and entertain us with your songs and stories so that we may choose a Bardic Champion.

Questers: We challenge you to join us as we follow Dante's travels through the nine circles of hell. Marvel at the mythological creatures and 14th century Florentine sinners. Abandon all hope, ye who enter this Quest!!! The Quest will start at 1 PM on Sunday. Children teams are welcome but must be accompanied by a parent. Quest written by Lady Elisabetta de Roma. After the Quest Baron Alexander MacGregor and Baroness Rhiannon de Carreg Cennen will hold a Baronial Court where our new champions will be presented.

Children are most welcome and there will be many activities in which they may participate. However, we ask that you supervise your children at all times. Anyone under the age of eighteen not with a parent must be accompanied by an adult and must present a consent form signed by the parent which lists the parent's contact information. If a minor does not have a blue membership card a minor's waiver must be signed by the parent / guardian and presented at Troll. Copies of said waiver will be available at Troll.

The camping area will be open from 4PM Friday until 11:30 Monday. Anyone on site before or after those times will be considered volunteers for set up and clean up - thank you in advance. It is a damp site which means beer, wine, and mead are permissible, but NO distilled liquor. Running water is not available on site, so please bring enough bottled water to last throughout the weekend. Porta-John's and dumpsters for garbage (and bins for recyclables) will also be provided. There will be a large central fire pit for socializing. Pets are welcome as long as they are leashed and cleaned up after.

Reservation Refund Policy: If, after sending in a reservation, you are unable to attend, please contact the autocrat before the event. Site fees will be refunded after the event. Feast fees will be refunded if we are able to resell your feast space. Troll will close when the Quest begins on Sunday. Unclaimed feast reservations will be sold off to a waiting list if there is one Saturday at noon. If you plan on arriving late, please let the autocrat know.

Merchants are most welcome and there is no merchant fee. We do ask that you bring your own tables and PLEASE pre-reg so we can allot you enough space. There will be an Inn on site and there are several fast food establishments a short distance away.

Directions:

From Route 206: Route 206 can be reached from Routes 287 and 22 from the north, and from Routes 95, 295, and 195 from the south. Take Route 206 to County road 514 [Amwell road] in Hillsborough, NJ.

From the North: turn right onto Route 514.

From the South, make a left. Stay on Route 514 for about 8 miles until you come to a 3-way intersection at a large white Church. Turn right onto Route 567 [River road]. A mile or so down the road you will see a white girder bridge on the left. Make a left over the bridge and a right into the site.

From Route 202:

From the North: Take your best road to Route 202 South. Take the left turn on CR629 [aka Pleasant Run Rd]. Go 3.2 miles until you see the white girder bridge. Turn right over bridge, site on right.

From the South: Follow 202 North to Neshanic Station turnoff which will be CR 629. Follow directions as listed above.

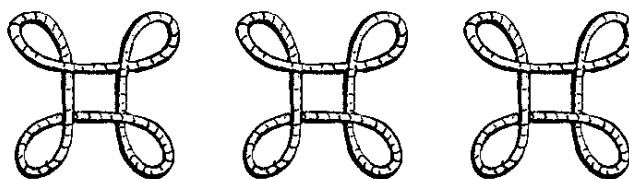
