From the Garden State Parkway:
Take exit 145 to Route 280 WEST. Go 4.3 miles to exit 7 for Pleasant Valley Way toward Millburn/Verona. Bear left at end of ramp (toward Millburn), turn left at Pleasant Valley Way SOUTH and go 0.4 miles to junction of Route 10/Mount Pleasant Ave. Turn right onto Route 10/Mount Pleasant Ave. WEST. The site is 1.2 miles down the road on the right.

Medieval Seder - Why is this night different from all other nights?

May 5th, 2012 Milltown, NJ

Come and learn how Amram the Gaon created the first complete haggadah for Passover. We will be using his ceremony as we take part in this educational event: a seder from northern France in c. 950. Ask the four questions, partake of the foods of a medieval seder, and decide for yourself whether it would be enough for you.

The seder will be led by Dom. Galefridus Peregrinus, with commentary and explanation by Lady Judith bas Rabbi Mendel. A delicious feast will be prepared for us by Lady Charis Accipiter. The food will be appropriate to the time, but not strictly kosher.

Because of SCA regulations, participants need to provide their own wine for the ceremony, but we will supply sufficient unfermented grape juice for everyone. The restrictions of Passover cooking mean there will be limited options for vegetarians and vegans. The site does not permit open flames. We ask that everyone dress in some attempt at clothing from before the 17th century. (Contact the event steward if you need help with this request.)

Welcome to our little village in the English countryside. Great news, you are just in time for our Mayday Fair! There will be festivities and merry making for three days so come and eat, drink and stay a while.

Celebratory tournaments will be hosted by the Baron and Baroness to determine their champions in heavy weapons, rapier, archery and thrown weapons. Also there will be youth combat for those not yet of age.

So too will be a contest of arts and sciences wherein their Excellencies will choose their champion of arts by aid of populace vote so come by and gaze upon the wonders made by hands. Bring anything you've made and would like to enter, there are no categories. After the feast we challenge you to gather around our fire pit and entertain us with your songs and stories. The best of all will be named our Bardic Champion.

As in years past there will be a brewing competition as well so please come share your skill.

Come ye on this fair may day to lay upon the green sward in the happy grove and thereto a great feast on Saturday evening prepared by Willa will be served. The feast will be limited to 100 gentles so we ask you to please register early.

For those looking to use their wits, we offer you: Quest the Musical. It promises to be fun and challenging for teams of three. Three shall be the number thou shalt have in thy team, and the number of the teammates shall be three. Four shalt thou not have, though two you may if need be. Five is right out. The Quest will begin at 1 PM on Sunday. Teams of children are welcome and encouraged, but they must be accompanied by an adult.

We insist that you supervise your children at all times. Anyone under the age of eighteen who is not with a parent must be accompanied by an adult and must pre-

sent a consent form signed by the parent and listing the parent contact information. If a minor does not have a blue membership card, a minor waiver must be signed by the parent/legal guardian and presented at Troll. Copies of this waiver are available on-line at <http://www.sca.org/docs/waivers.html> and will be available at the event.

The camping area will be open from 4 PM Friday until 11:30 AM Monday. The site is Damp which means beer, wine, and mead are permissible but please no distilled liquor. Running water is not available on site so please bring enough bottled water to last the weekend. Port-a-Johns, and dumpsters for garbage will also be provided. In addition to feast gear, you will need chairs and a table or a blanket to sit on for the feast. There will be a large, central fire pit for socializing. Pets are welcome so long as they are quiet, leashed and cleaned up after. As with children, we insist that you supervise your pets at all times. Gentles with overly loud and/or aggressive pets will be asked to remove the pets from site.

There will be an Inn on site run by Rachel of Gwynedd. Several fast food establishments are a short distance away.

From 287: Take Exit 17 and merge onto Route 202/206S. Stay on 202/206S for 3.7 miles. Turn left at Chubb Way. It will turn into S. Branch Road. After 3.8 miles turn left at Pleasant Run Road (County Road 567). It will change its name to River Road. After almost a mile, turn right onto Elm Street and go over a white girder bridge. The site is on the right.

From the South: Use Route 202. It can be reached from Routes 31 and 29 from the south. Take Route 202 north. Turn right onto Pleasant Run Road (County Road 629). Continue to follow County Road 629. It becomes County Road 567 (River Road). About 3 miles from Route 202, you'll see the white girder bridge. Make a right turn onto the bridge (Elm Street). You'll see the site on the right.

From eastern NJ: Take Rt 287 exit 14B (a left-hand exit) onto Route 22 West for 3 miles. Take the exit for Routes 206/202 south, then keep to the left to take Route 202 over the Somerville Circle. After 5.4 miles, turn left at the traffic light onto Chubb Way. Then follow the directions for people coming from the North.
