

A Day at the Lichtenauer Fighting Academy

Saturday, September 18th, 2004

Hosted by Canton of Marwick - Edison, NJ

Event Last Modified: May 15th, 2004

Come spend a day at the Lichtenauer Academy, studying the Secrets of German Medieval Swordsmanship! Count Rhys of Harlech, fechtmeister of Die Schlachtschule ("The School of Battle"), will teach techniques from medieval fechtbucher (fighting manuals) written by Johannes Lichtenauer, Hans Talhoffer, and Sigmund Ringeck, in addition to 'Le Jeu de la Hache'.

The morning will be spent reviewing the materials, and after lunch there will be hands-on practice of the techniques using wooden "waster" daggers, long-swords, and poleaxes. Afterwards, students will gather at "die Taverne", where there will be board, card, and dice games, a hearty repast, and a cash bar for those who desire ein Glas Bier with their meal.

The event, sponsored by the Canton of Marwick, will run from 10:30am - 7:30pm at Moose Lodge #1978 in Edison, NJ. Adult fees will be \$11 for the day, plus \$5 for dinner (The Non-member surcharge of \$3 applies.)

FROM THE NORTH: Take route I-287 South to Exit #3 - New Durham/Metuchen. At end of ramp turn RIGHT at traffic light onto New Durham Rd. Go to the first traffic light and turn RIGHT onto Talmadge Road. Go to the traffic light and turn LEFT onto Coolidge St. Go 0.2 miles, make a HARD LEFT at the Moose street sign-post, then RIGHT into Moose driveway/parking lot.

FROM THE SOUTH: Take route I-287 North to Exit #2B - New Brunswick/Rt. 27 South. Ramp traffic flows onto Rt. 27 South. Go 0.7 miles to third traffic light, and turn RIGHT onto Talmadge Road. Go 1.8 miles, again to third traffic light and turn LEFT onto Coolidge St. Travel 0.2 miles, make a HARD LEFT at the Moose street sign-post, then turn RIGHT into Moose driveway/parking lot.

FROM THE GARDEN STATE PARKWAY NORTH OR SOUTH: take Exit 127 for Routes 440/I-287 (Route 440 West becomes Route 287 North). Take I-287 to exit #2B, then follow directions above "From the south".

Although they want as much VIKING as they can get from us, any demo from pre-1600 Scandinavia is welcome. ** YOU DO NOT HAVE TO BE A VIKING TO GO*** Just be able to tell your audience that the craft you are demonstrating was practiced in Scandinavia before 1600. Garb from any time period before 1600 in Scandinavia is also acceptable o talk about the SCA and what we do.

Please bring chairs, tables, pavilions, or any accoutrements you need for your demo.

Fighters are welcome! Round shield preferred, but we welcome you all.

Some camping is allowed but I need to let them know how ahead of time how many people are camping. If you would like to camp please let me know. Do not just show up with a tent.

If you know your going please let me know, I will be providing them with a list of people by September 22nd. These people will have food vouchers waiting for them to use for lunch.

Seraglio 2004, Murder on the Silk Road

This is the formal declaration that "Seraglio 2004" will take place on Saturday, 20 November, 2004 at our traditional site, the Unitarian Society of New Brunswick, at 176 Tices Lane, East Brunswick, New Jersey. Attendance will be limited to 80 on-board reservations. The cost of the event will be \$18.00 and reservations are mandatory as the hall is fairly small.

This year, in addition to various classes to be held during the day (teachers needed), there will be an interactive murder mystery game with the theme of, "Murder on the Silk Road", see below for details The Author of the Game is Baron Dur of Hidden Mountain.

The game will be played upon your entry to The Swampish Caravansari, all are invited, nay encouraged to participate! The game will continue on during the Feast, which will also be punctuated with glorious entertainment.

The site will open at 10 a.m., and clean-up begun by 10:30 p.m. in order that we be quit of the building by 11:00 p.m.

Merchants are welcome, but there is VERY limited space; and Merchants will be asked to provide their own tables and let us know how big the tables are when they reserve their space. There will be space for about 5-7 Merchants to ply their wares.

There will be a sumptuous Feast with foodstuffs commensurate to the area of the world that we will be focusing on: The Silk Roads; The Swampish Caravanseri is situated in the City of Samarkand. Feasters will have the option of Eastern (floor with cushions) or Westernstyle (standard chairs and tables) seating. Bringing one's own pillows, fluffy or otherwise is encouraged, so that you may be comfortable during the murder inquiry. Livestock of an Unnatural and/or Ersatz Nature are welcome.

There will be Crafts and Projects of an A&S nature on display throughout the entire event; and perhaps a more active A&S activity, at the whim of the Minister of A&S.

The usage of the area of the Silk Roads location "offers opportunities to consider major themes in...history-the significance of trade, the spread of religions, the diffusion of technologies and artistic motifs, and the development of powerful military forces and empires. Yet perhaps even more appealing...is the opportunity" for people of many different personae to interact in an historical milieu that will allow some learning to take place, inadvertently (shhh! don't tell). People from variously different places and cultures met, here in Samarkand along the Silk Road, were suspicious of and got to know one another, eventually. The courageous among you may even be tempted to speak to someone from Another Land, and since we are in a Caravanseri, that means everyone; even you! And it will be a lot of fun.

Teachers for classes please contact the Provost and tell him what you'd like to teach. Just to clarify, subjects related to the Silk Roads, Near, Middle and Far East are encouraged, but if you have something really cool to teach on an unrelated subject, we welcome you to do so. Kitchen crew will also be needed.

A little Historical Information about the Silk Road

Samarkand was at a crossroads of the Silk Road, the route that goods, people and most importantly, ideas traveled along to connect East and West. It is located in present-day Uzbekistan. This route "linked the civilizations of Eurasia for much of pre-modern history, starting as early as the second century B.C.E., if not earlier. China, Central Asia, West Asia, and, to a lesser extent, Europe, were placed in touch with each other via the Silk Roads. The economic significance of their contacts in pre-1500 history may have been exaggerated, but their cultural impact can hardly be overstated, and the political influences, particularly during the era of the Mongol empire, have only, of late, received much attention.

Major themes of cultural borrowing, interactions of civilizations, and the development of new economic institutions and technologies to facilitate commerce, together with the sheer excitement of travel and adventure, can be conveyed through historical descriptions of the Silk Roads"
