Archery and Thrown Weapons Are Back in Settmour Swamp By Lord Silvanus Woodwose

Throughout my life I have occasionally been exposed to the SCA—it is kind of hard not to be when you run in the circles I ran in. Aviation Electronics Technicians, Magic the Gathering players, Dungeons and Dragons players, fans of Star Wars and Star Trek, World of Warcraft, but also nature lovers and people who enjoy camping and all things outdoors. The SCA has everything that you ever enjoyed in your mundane life, but they do it with style and they do it together. Archery and Thrown Weapons are no exception. This is what ultimately dragged me, begrudgingly at first but later relieved that I had finally found a home, into the fold at Settmour Swamp.

The first step was finding an archery practice I could actually attend two years ago during the pandemic lockdown. That was no easy task. However, Hrefna Sigurðardóttir was already on the task and located one only a mere hour and a half from our home in the barony of Bhakail. We showed up early one morning to what they called "site clean-up", which was actually just dragging branches around the Honorable Lord Mikael Melrakki's backyard. And that was the beginning of it all. We made our intent clear that we wished to bring Archery and Thrown Weapons back to our Barony in Settmour Swamp from Day 2 of attending their practices every week, and it was Mikael and Lady Maryna Borowska who began training us. We were very fortunate to have found such a practice where Archery and Thrown were carried out in someone's backyard, on the same day, 40 feet from each other, and with two very knowledgeable marshals to train us.

After getting Marshal status in both disciplines, Hrefna and I almost immediately began searching for a site somewhere in our barony to hold practices. If any of you have ever looked for a site to host any event, you already know how difficult it can be. "Hello, Parks and Recreation? Me and about 10 of my friends would like to hurl deadly arrows and knives around your park every weekend. Is that going to be cool with you?" And trust me when I say, it was indeed not cool with them.

Four months after getting marshal status and beginning my search for a suitable site, I suffered a major heart attack. I had to have a triple bypass surgery to save my life. After that, it would be another seven months until I was even healthy enough to start attending events again. However, I knew many of my fellow Swampies wanted to have these practices back, and I sincerely wanted to give it to them. At what seemed to be the last minute of the foreseeable Archery season this year we were fortunate enough to secure a site in Secaucus thanks to the tenacious and very motivated Lady Gráinne MacCleud, who found the site and convinced the mayor to give us the keys to the kingdom.

The turnout of people at these practices has been the reward for me, after all that I have endured. I truly enjoy seeing people arrive in the morning, bow in hand, bright smile on their faces while the range is still wet from the dew. And I love the sound of arrows hitting their mark, the thunk of an ax in the target, and the community that this sport creates. Archery and Thrown Weapons are back and will live on in the Swamp of Settmour.

Artisan of the Quarter Jan Janowicz Bogdanski

How did you find the SCA? What about it made you get involved? What keeps you involved now?

Early my freshman year in college there was something called the "Activities Fair" where all of the clubs on campus set up displays around the Student Union to recruit new members. As I was walking towards the Union, I saw a mess of guys in what looked sort of like armor hitting each other with sword-like objects; I spent the whole day talking to them, and they invited me to a picnic the next day behind one of the dorms. The picnic consisted of music and dancing and people dressed up in something that looked medieval, and I was hooked. I went back to my dorm, called home, and said to my dad, "I found it!"

You see, when I was growing up my dad would talk about wanting to open a restaurant with a medieval theme, and the food would be served on long tables family style, and he wanted to call it "Henry VIII." This was the 70s, long before any of us had heard of Medieval Times, so when I found the SCA it was almost like déjà vu.

Why have you stayed in the SCA? What do you like about it? What do you feel are its weaknesses as a group?

In recent years I've asked myself that same question. Partially – to be honest – it's nothing more than inertia and forty years of investment. More optimistically, I still have a lot of "preseventeenth century Western culture" that I want to explore, and the SCA is the framework that really facilitates that. I still have friends here and I still experience those "magic moments" on occasion.

I do like that I've been able to find like-minded and supportive people in the various areas I'm interested in, and the "big tent" exposes me to things that may not be part of my focus, but turn out to be extremely interesting.

In recent years I think that the SCA hasn't done a great job at bringing in and retaining people. I do realize that the demographic that I was part of is no longer a key target, but even when we bring people in, it seems like we don't spend enough time and effort on keeping them. When I attended my first few events, I had people essentially holding my hand throughout to make sure I understood what was going on. When I started getting serious about fighting and arts, I had mentors in those areas to help me get my feet. We need more of that.

Tell us about your art! How did you get started and what's your latest cool project(s)? What do you want to tell people to encourage them to take up this art, or get better at it? My first response is "which one"? I had an interest in calligraphy and illumination from the very beginning of my involvement in the SCA. When I moved to Iron Bog, I found that the local expert, Mistress Gabriella, had just stepped down as Tyger Clerk. She fed my interest and introduced me to Mistress Dorren. I've been doing work for the Signet ever since. At the moment, I have a backlog in the style of the Benedictional of St. Æthelwold on my board which is going quite well. It is a TON of gilding, but so far it is coming along nicely.

I started woodworking because I wanted to improve my presentation. Mundanely I've been woodworking for quite some time. I have just completed a Savonarola chair which was a

commission. [See article below] It was an interesting and daunting project and I already have some refinements in mind if I do another.

Lastly, I discovered Italo-Byzantine painting a few years ago through an egg tempera class I took at Pennsic, coupled with an icon writing one I took outside the SCA taught by the same person. It's a narrow style, but it really fascinates me. It's very challenging too because egg tempera reacts very differently from modern gouache. I recently completed an "Annunciation" which is inspired by works of Simone Martini, and I'm beginning to lay out an "Adoration of the Magi."

With anything I have two pieces of advice: "practice" and "we all started somewhere." Any endeavor is an evolution so don't worry about how that first piece looks, or the tenth, or the twentieth. Is it better than the last one? Did you learn something in the attempt that you can apply to the next one? Then continue to enjoy your journey!

What do you want to tell people who don't know what the SCA is about?

I always like to say that the SCA is all of my activities wrapped up in a single hobby. It is the umbrella for my interests. In the end, the SCA is what you make it. You will get out of it what you put into it, and no matter how obscure your interest, there's a good chance there is someone else exploring that interest as well. Embrace the community and explore. There was a lot going on during the medieval and renaissance periods – you're sure to find something to interest you.



Creating a Savonarola Chair

I've been woodworking since I was a teenager and helped my dad build one of the houses we lived in. Over the years, I've built bookshelves, end tables, cabinets, and chests. As a result, the idea of building furniture for the SCA came pretty naturally. Recently I was commissioned to build a Savonarola chair, commonly known as an "X-chair." Since I had both time on my hands, and a supply of rough-cut red oak boards, I decided to take up the challenge.

Preparations

Thankfully, existing plans for such a chair can be found online both with the St Thomas Guild (https://thomasguild.blogspot.com/) as well as Atlantia's MOAS site (https://moas.atlantia.sca.org/archive/wsnlinks/index.php?action=displaycat&catid=206). Prior to starting this project, I completed a different medieval folding chair, so I felt comfortable with building the folding mechanism.

Building the chair

The first step was to lay out the leg sections. I took a number of pieces of graph paper, taped them together, and sketched the legs full size based on the plans in the drawings. I then transferred the drawing to a stiff piece of cardboard to create a reusable template. I used the template to cut a number of legs and slats out of scrap wood to function as a "proof of concept" to ensure that I was building the assembly correctly.

Next came production. Since I was dealing with rough-cut lumber, I first had to plane everything to a uniform thickness prior to cutting out all of the pieces. A nice benefit of the shape of the legs is that I was able to get an equal number of slats out of the same board, which was convenient since an equal number of slats were necessary. Using that the template I was able to precisely create the legs and slats with the holes in the same locations for all pieces. Aside from the legs and slats, there were also feet, arms, and the back to be cut and shaped. With all of the pieces cut and drilled, I lightly sanded them, applied two coats of linseed oil, and assembled the legs and slats by pounding half inch oak dowels through the holes in the legs and slats. I did make a change to the original design by pegging the feet and arms to the legs instead of using mortices and tenons, but I thought it would be easier in the long run. The back slides into a channel cut into the arms.

Lessons Learned

The chair does not quite sit flat, so I believe that next time I'll move the central hole in the slats by about a sixteenth of an inch. I also need to make some modifications to how I finish the leg pieces so that they are slightly more uniform. This was quite a challenging piece to tackle, but extremely satisfying in the end.
