Summary of Baronial Business Meeting Minutes December 19, 2023 Held virtually

Present: Markus Farmaðr (chairing), Judith bas Rabbi Mendel (taking notes), Alexander Krause, Alger von Ze'ev, Alys Mackyntoich, Charis Accipiter, Douglas Henry, Emidio di Arquata, Eva Vach Wyltt, Galefridus Peregrinus, Hekja Hornabrjótr, Martina de la Rosa, Natal'ia Bolotnikova, Orlando di Sforza, Vika Grigina z Prahy, Wulfgar Silfrahárr

The minutes and summary from November were approved.

Officer Terms

The officers voted in favor of having Hrefna continue as Social Media Officer. Wulfgar is stepping down as Marshal of Fence as of tonight. Alger is stepping up into that position.

Mudthaw

Eva submitted a bid to autocrat. The event would take place at the Warren County Technical School. She and several others are planning to do a walk-through of the site. Eva calculated a breakeven attendance of 350 people. The price to attend will be \$25 for members, \$30 for nonmembers, with lower cost for college students and youth. Eva is pulling together a team to work with her, putting newer people in more leading roles. We discussed dayboard. We could do it as a fundraiser as we have in previous Mudthaws, and this time it would be to benefit the barony. The officers voted to accept Eva's bid. The event announcement can now be posted.

BGI

Hekja said she will autocrat the event. They are still looking for a head cook. BGI is scheduled for February 25th. They are drumming up interest in the bardic and brewing competitions.

Quest/Day of Champions

We should be able to get a contract soon—we had to wait for the new year. Rosa is interested in autocrating and is working on a bid. The officers discussed having a brewing champion. We don't currently have that position. The advantage is that we could then challenge other groups to a brew-off. Do we need to add the position to the bylaws?

We would like to keep the A&S and brewing competitions for champions at Quest. The thought is that the Day of Champions would be for martial championships. We'd like to hold it in September. Alys pointed out that doing it this way would avoid the conflict with War of Roses. If people want to be on the champions teams at Pennsic, they have to fight/fence/shoot at Roses. We discussed possible sites for the Day of Champions. Charis will put out a call for bids to autocrat.

Officer Reports

<u>Chatelaine</u>: Gwenhoivar sent a message: Nothing new to report. No new reach-outs or contacts. Eva sent: She replied to questions from one person, and he came to the schola.

Knight Marshal: Douglas said fighting is going well, with 25 or more people coming weekly. Rusted Woodlands is using the upstairs. The church where the practices are held put out a call for help in raising money to repair some doors. We contributed toward the cost—Douglas said he was very proud of the generosity of the fighters. Alexander is now his deputy.

Heraldry: Submissions made at Quest have been considered by the heralds, and a couple of Swamp submissions have passed. Next month the heralds will start on submissions made at NRWC. Pennsic submissions should be looked at in February. There will be a heraldic consultation table at 12th Night, with a number of people to consult with who have niche specialties, such as African names. No badge has been registered for Settmour Swamp, and there is no conflict if we want to use the sinking tower. The officers approved spending \$9 to make the submission.

<u>Mol</u>: Emidio said that after the holidays he will do a zoom call 1-on-1 with Ellesbeth to make sure he has the process down. She will provide backup at Mudthaw.

Marshal of Fence: Wulfgar gave a final report. Drew University may work out as a place to hold practices, but they are negotiating about the price. They have already begun advertising SCA fencing on campus. One advantage of this location is that it is on public transportation routes. Wulfgar will contact another place as well. Wulfgar will go over the final report he is making to kingdom. Fencing practice is starting up again on January 4. Alger also reported: About 10 people are coming to practice weekly, so they are close to the target of being able to cover the rental cost of the church. They are looking at moving the practice somewhere else.

A&S: Natal'ia said the Swamp Stomp was well attended though it was rainy. She'd like to do them quarterly; the next one might be in February. She'd also like to start up virtual A&S meetings again.

<u>Exchequer</u>: Vika said she has started to close out the quarter. There are some outstanding receivables. She drafted a budget for 2024, which she showed us. She projected that we would make about some money from Mudthaw, Quest, and the Schola in 2024, but said her numbers were just a good guess. She did not include Ducal or Day of Champions in her figures. Galefridus mentioned he would like to see more events with feasts, and Vika mentioned that she'd like real food budgets with feast bids. Vika recommended that we start talking about a land agent and bids as early as possible.

The minutes and summary from October were approved.

Fall Schola - Nos Calan Gaeaf

Elizabeth and Vika reported. It was a nice site and had a good kitchen. The event made \$25. Only 80 people came. They would like to make this a yearly event. 33 classes were held, with a mixture of beginner and advanced classes. Several of the teachers had never taught before. Lunch was incredible, thanks to Charis. Lots of pies. Thanks to all who worked to pull it off.

Mudthaw

Markus is looking hard for an autocrat. Galefridus volunteered to co-autocrat with someone—making it possible for someone less experienced to step up knowing they will have support. Ciaran is willing to co-autocrat with Galefridus. Markus said if he didn't hear back from the people he's been asking within a month, he will take the two of them up on their offer.

We have been looking for a site. Charis looked at the Warren County Technical School. It has plenty of parking and has room for fencing and fighting outside. While the site is easy to get to, there is no nearby public transportation. We could use the entire building, including the gym for fencing if the weather is bad. The fencers would need to wear non-scuff shoes. There is a paved area (not the parking lot) that heavy fighters could use if the grass is not useable. The kitchen looks good. We would have to have a police officer, which would add \$900 to the cost. We could overflow parking to the county college next door. Dayboard is not practical for an event of this size. We could also do something as a fundraiser.

We discussed pricing for admission. We used to charge \$25, but dropped it to \$20 as we subsidized it. The recommendation was to charge \$25 and \$30 for nonmembers; costs have gone up. We need rebuild our cash reserves. East Kingdom will take 20% since it is a royal progress. We considered offering a family cap on the price. We can tell the royals that the Mudthaw date is firm.

Quest

We should start planning for Quest now. The price may be increasing. We will start looking for volunteers for Quest. The hard part is that the event is 3 ½ days long.

Could we use Vasa Park for a Day of Champions? Doing that would mean these contests wouldn't conflict with Roses. It will require another autocrat—is that possible? We'll consider the idea. One of the purposes of The Day in the Solar event is to help people get clothing ready for Pennsic. Maybe we should combine it with the Day of Champions.

Idea for a New Event

A 16th century Venetian carnival immersive event. Maybe held in February 2025. Denis is willing to autocrat. We have other volunteers for some of the major jobs. We could focus some A&S sessions on making appropriate garb for it. A bid will be submitted. We should cap attendance at the event to around 100 people, but it means the cost to attend will be higher.

Officer Terms

We will vote on the Social Media officer position next month. Hrefna is willing to continue.

Swamp Stomp

Will be held on December 3rd from 12-5pm at the Great Swamp Watershed Association in Morristown. It will include a weaving circle and a potluck.

Officer Reports

<u>Heraldry:</u> Submissions are making their way through the system. Heraldry is prospering. Alys ran a track of classes at the recent schola and did consultations.

Chamberlain: Emeline sent a message saying she did not have much to report.

<u>Chatelaine</u>: Gwenhoivar said she is plugging the SCA everywhere. No one has reached out to us recently. The demo we discussed last month didn't happen because there was not enough interest. Gwenhoivar said she would like to follow up with the new people who attended the schola but has no contact information for them.

Exchequer: Vika said we are in decent financial shape. It is important that autocrats post site contracts so they can be used by others when needed. Vika is working on a 2024 budget and will have it ready for the next meeting. We need to decide what events to hold in order to do the budget. She reminded the officers that we need to include something for the operating costs of the barony when deciding on the cost for an event. No action is needed on the storage unit.

<u>Chronicler</u>: Lillain sent a message: "I have finished the Mudpuppy for the most recent quarter and will be ready to print with the approval of the October minutes."

<u>Knight Marshal</u>: Douglas sent a message: The Nutley practice is going well, with about 20 people attending each week. Douglas will have a deputy soon.

<u>Marshal of Fence</u>: Wulfgar said that the contributions from fencing practice have covered the cost of renting the site for the last three months. The practices are going well; 10-11 people are coming every week. He would like to rename the practice "Fencing and A&S Practice." Interest has been expressed in fencing garb. The practice schedule will be different for November and December: no practice on Thanksgiving or for 2-3 weeks in December.

Webminister: The baronial website is still running.

<u>Social Media</u>: The need for an autocrat for Mudthaw has been posted. The Mudpuppy is going out through email. Hrefna needs a deputy.

<u>Captain of the Archers</u>: Silvanus said they finally had a practice without rain. Temperature also determines whether to hold a practice--40° is the cut-off. He hopes to squeeze in one more practice this year.

<u>A&S</u>: Natal'ia said the metal working class had to be cancelled because of rain. They will reschedule in the Spring.

Heraldry: Submissions made at Quest have been considered by the heralds, and a couple of Swamp submissions have passed. Next month the heralds will start on submissions made at NRWC. Pennsic submissions should be looked at in February. There will be a heraldic consultation table at 12th Night, with a number of people to consult with who have niche specialties, such as African names. No badge has been registered for Settmour Swamp, and there is no conflict if we want to use the sinking tower. The officers approved spending \$9 to make the submission.

<u>Mol</u>: Emidio said that after the holidays he will do a zoom call 1-on-1 with Ellesbeth to make sure he has the process down. She will provide backup at Mudthaw.

Marshal of Fence: Wulfgar gave a final report. Drew University may work out as a place to hold practices, but they are negotiating about the price. They have already begun advertising SCA fencing on campus. One advantage of this location is that it is on public transportation routes. Wulfgar will contact another place as well. Wulfgar will go over the final report he is making to kingdom. Fencing practice is starting up again on January 4. Alger also reported: About 10 people are coming to practice weekly, so they are close to the target of being able to cover the rental cost of the church. They are looking at moving the practice somewhere else.

A&S: Natal'ia said the Swamp Stomp was well attended though it was rainy. She'd like to do them quarterly; the next one might be in February. She'd also like to start up virtual A&S meetings again.

<u>Exchequer</u>: Vika said she has started to close out the quarter. There are some outstanding receivables. She drafted a budget for 2024, which she showed us. She projected that we would make about some money from Mudthaw, Quest, and the Schola in 2024, but said her numbers were just a good guess. She did not include Ducal or Day of Champions in her figures. Galefridus mentioned he would like to see more events with feasts, and Vika mentioned that she'd like real food budgets with feast bids. Vika recommended that we start talking about a land agent and bids as early as possible.
